



Appendix A of the Professional Divisions manual states: "G. Provides two division membership printouts/year to division chairmen. One printout provided upon chairman's election and one upon request. (Divisions will be charged for additional printout requests.)" Chairman Neil Todreas received a printout and one carbon copy of the Technical Group's membership at the time of his election. He is entitled to request one more set at some time during the year at no charge to the technical group. I do not know if Mr. Todreas was aware that Dr. Cermak was making a request for the second free printout. The printout requests are taken in the Secretariat and not by my department. The person who processed this request is no longer with the Society.

I will suggest to the Secretariat that when a printout is requested by someone other than the chairman of the division or technical group, the chairman should be notified before the request is processed.
