Shripad Revankar chaired the Program Committee meeting in place of Martin Bertodano, who was unable to attend.

1. Opening

Shripad Revankar called the THD Program Committee Meeting to order at 3:05 p.m.

2. Agenda

Meeting agenda was introduced (Attachment B) and was approved.

3. Minutes from June 2004 Meeting

The meeting minutes from June 2004 meeting at Pittsburgh, PA were approved without further comment.

4. Action Items from June 2004 Meeting

a. NURETH-11 registration fee

The 700-Euro registration fee for NURETH-11 was mentioned as being a potential financial difficulty for some attendees. International participants have previously requested a fee reduction. Yassin Hassan will look into the fee for a Mathematics and Computation Division meeting that will be held at the same venue prior to the NURETH meeting.

b. NURETH-12

Discussion centered on the proposals to host the conference and the year of the conference. The committee agreed that the year of the conference will be 2007.

Regarding solicitation of proposals, Martin Bertodano was to announce the request

for proposals. Since the latest status was unclear, Shripad Revankar left a phone message for Martin to email Karen Vierow on this activity as soon as possible.

Before reviewing the Pittsburgh section proposal submitted at the June 2004 meeting, several members felt that confirmation is necessary that all local sections were aware of the solicitation. Other members stated that since we have a strong proposal now, we should vote at this meeting as to the acceptability of the Pittsburgh proposal. This would provide the hosts with valuable time for preparations and allow THD to have the meeting put on the ANS calendar. The matter left for further discussion by the Executive Committee.

Bill Cheung suggested that a screening committee be formed to evaluate the proposals against criteria such as financial viability. The committee nominees are Bob Martin (Chair), Tom Larson, Bill Cheung, Yassin Hassan and Karen Vierow. The committee will evaluate and send recommendations to the Executive Committee. Approval of the committee composition will be requested of the Executive Committee.

Kurshad Muftuoglu provided handouts of the Pittburgh proposal (Attachment C). Special features of the conference would include a special session on full height OECD benchmark boiling tests, planned by K. Ivanov and Larry Hochreiter. He requested the evaluation criteria for financial assessment. Bill will send the evaluation criteria to Kurshad.

5. 2005 ANS Winter Meeting Program

Larry Hochreiter will identify potential panelists for the panel session on 10CFR50.46 revisions

Don McEligot is responsible for a panel on Basic Thermal Hydraulic Research.

6. International Topical Meetings.

a. NUTHOS-6 (Japan, 2004): post meeting report
Reported by Jong Kim for Hisashi Ninokata) (Attachment D)
The international turnout was strong. There was some disappointment in the small French turnout of 7 papers.

If NURETH-12 is to be held in 2007, NUTHOS-7 should be moved to 2008. Slide 6 of Attachment D suggests that NUTHOS-7 be in 2007.

There are probably 2 typos on slide 5, where 15,6000 KJPY should be 15,600 KJPY.

b. NURETH-11 (France, 2005) update report
The income to ANS is unclear. There was no other discussion.

c. NURETH-12 (Pittsburgh, 2007/8): Committees, etc. Discussion is included under item 4.

7. 2006 NHTC

a. Discuss co-sponsor issues: ANS, ASME

The conferences were too close together in 2004 for ANS THD to participate. There was not enough time to prepare for cosponsoring in 2005. The division will consider cosponsoring the 2006 conference.

b. Propose Sessions

Chang Oh is the liaison to ASME. Sessions proposed by THD will be emailed to him

8. Web page subcommittee report

Bob Martin updated the web page this week. He scanned in and added 8 years of meeting minutes to the web page.

Yassin asked if technical papers could be posted. Bob replied that if there is enough interest, we can publish 2 newsletters per year and have ANS pay for costs.

9. Editorial subcommittee report

This subcommittee does not exist.

10. Membership subcommittee report

Yassin noted that there are 115 student members, an increase of 40%, and that the Division should be doing more student recruitment.

Jovica Riznic reported an increase of 27 new members for a total of 880.

Bill suggested that the Division maintain 27-30 active PC members.

Yassin stated that Kurshad will be the PC secretary from June 2005.

11. New business

Tom Larson requested a THD representative to present the THD session descriptions for the Winter 2005 meeting to the National Program Committee. Shripad volunteered.

Introduction

The International Meeting on Nuclear Reactor Thermal-Hydraulics, NURETH, is the major meeting sponsored by the ANS Thermal-Hydraulics Division. Three out of the last four meetings took place abroad. The most recent U.S. meeting was on the West Coast. The proposed Pittsburgh meeting in 2007 will be the first one on the East Coast since 1995. Pittsburgh, conveniently located for many institutions will provide a venue for the thermal-hydraulics community.

The ANS Pittsburgh Section has hosted a number of successful international topicals. The team has a proven record of delivering strong technical meetings with excellent profits.

The Pittsburgh Section is volunteering to host the NURETH-12 meeting and support the THD in meeting organization and logistics.

Proposed Topics for the Conference

Following is a list of the main topics considered for the conference. These topics are similar to those of the last two NURETH meeting. Subheadings will be expanded by obtaining concurrence with the chairs and the steering committee.

A special session on OECD/NRC Benchmark based on NUPEC BWR Full-Size Fine-Mesh Bundle Tests (BFBT) is planned. Concurrence is obtained for this topic from Professors Ivanov and Hochreiter. The projected timetable of the benchmark studies corresponds well with the proposed date of October 2007.

Conference Finances




