1. Opening

Dr. Bolotnov called the meeting to order. Roll call and quorum met.

2. Approval of meeting agenda

A DRAFT agenda (amended during the meeting) was provided for approval (APPENDIX A)

MOTION: Dr. Shaver moved to approve the agenda SECOND: Dr. Delgado

NO DISCUSSION All in favor. Agenda is APPROVED.

3. Approval of minutes from 2023 ANS Summer EC Meeting

The DRAFT minutes of the 2023 ANS Summer Meeting have been provided for review and approval.

MOTION: Dr. Delgado moved to approve the minutes. SECOND: Dr. Shaver

NO DISCUSSION

All in favor. Minutes are APPROVED.

4. ANS Student Conference

a. The 2024 Student Conference was discussed by Sean Bistany. The conference theme is "Nuclear is the Keystone" and the meeting is expected to cover a broad range of topics. Tours of TMI, Waltz Mill, a local brewery, and the Penn State creamery are being planned.

b. The 2024 Student Conference is scheduled for April 4-6, 2024 at Penn State.

5. Action items from 2022 ANS Winter meeting:

a. Industrial Liaison action item. Progress by the industrial liaison task force was discussed by Dr. Liao. The task force has completed a proposed revision to the bylaws. The proposal is for an Industrial Engagement Committee that ... « Shall be composed of seven (7) members, of which at least five (5) are industry representatives. No employment restrictions are placed on the remaining two (2) or less members. The Industry Engagement Committee shall be responsible for engaging nuclear industry and report to Executive Committee."

MOTION: Steve Bajorek moved to approve the proposal.

SECOND: Bao-Wen Yang

Action: Send revised bylaws to the Bylaws and Rules Committee.

c. International Liaison. Progress on the international liaison was discussed by Dr. Ferry Roelofs. Completed is a list of thermal-hydraulic expert in the EU. The next proposed step is add a topical committee with SEDB. Current work is on a leaflet to distribute. Feedback is requested.

6. Action Items from the 2023 Program Committee

a. The 2023 Winter meeting has about 50 submissions, which is an all-time low. At the WAM the THD will have 15 technical sessions and 2 panel sessions. The downward trend is similar to the overall ANS Society trend. But THD represents roughly 20% of all submittals so the trend is concerning. The 2024 Summer meeting is expected to also be low in THD submittals.

b. There was discussion on the new ANS division sign-up process which no longer has ANS members designate a primary division. ANS members can now select several divisions. This lead to additional discussion on how to increase THD membership. Bob Martin suggested expanding the number of engagement groups by including academia and the National Labs.

7. Chair Report

a. Updates from HQ (Igor Bolotnov for Annalisa Manera):

1. Continued process to moving to new space. Move is expected around Feb 1, 2024.

2. Signed lease for small space in Washington DC (1 office and large conference room). Division leaders can use it for conference room space.

3. Work is about 85-95% done in shift to new association platform. Working on integration between new platform and current metrics platform should be done by the next winter meeting.

4. ANS is in middle of budget season for 2024 budget with significant expenses to move forward on certification and a one-time expense related to the HQ move

b. Certification Program (Steven Arndt):

Steve Arndt described the new Certification Program and its content. The Certification Program is intended to be non-technical in nature and provide a learning opportunity to those lacking experience in the nuclear field. Some top topics selected include licensing and US certifications, NPP Economics, and Power plant design.

c. Webinars (Marilyn Delgado):

Marilyn Delgado discussed the THD Webinar program and requested future topics for these webinars. The suggestion was made that we target younger members of ANS and THD, and "History of the THD" was

suggested as a possible topic. Igor Bolotnov recommended that we take advantage of university seminars, many of which are video recorded.

8. Treasurer' Report (Dr. Roelofs):

Dr. Roelofs gave the THD financial report, noting that the division saw a significant increase in income primarily due to higher revenue from NURETH-20. Expenses were normal and were generally for plaques. In some good news on the scholarship funds, Dr. Roelofs reported that the Raj Segal family approved that book royalties go to fund that award. Dr. Roelofs will get the link from the publisher to make the transactions efficient.

Dr. Yang proposed the division provide \$3000 for a THD career fair table at the next student conference.

MOTION: Dr. Yang moved to approve the motion. SECOND: Dr. Shaver.

Motion approved.

9. Program Committee Report (Dr. Shaver).

a. NURETH-21 update (Dr. Cho). NURETH-21 is scheduled to take place August 31 through September 5, 20225 in Busan, Korea. Busan is the second largest city in Korea. The estimated attendance is 600 participants. Important dates are October 25, 2024 for abstract submittal and January 31, 2025 for full (draft) paper submittal.

b. NUTHOS-14: NUTHOS-14 will be held in Vancouver, Canada from August 25-28, 2024. This is the first time in North America. Abstract submittal is open and draft papers due January 31, 2024.
